



Recycle Right this Holiday Season

We want to help make recycling right easy for you this holiday season. Follow these tips to make sure you have the greenest holiday possible!

- Doing your holiday shopping online? Be sure to flatten cardboard boxes and remove packing materials like peanuts, bubble wrap, and air pillows. The flattened cardboard is good to go in your recycling container, and the air pillows and bubble wrap can be dropped off at a local retailer to be recycled with plastic bags. - Shopping in stores? Don't forget to bring your reusable bags! And if you end up with plastic shopping bags, remember that they are not acceptable in your curbside recycling cart. Instead, you can drop plastic bags (along with plastic wraps and other materials) at a retailer near you. Find a location by visiting [Plastic Film Recycling](#)
- Did you know that wrapping paper is not recyclable? Because the paper is shiny and laminated, it's not like office paper or mail that you typically throw in your recycling bin. Make sure to throw wrapping paper in the trash, or even better, reuse it to wrap your next gift!

NO Food Waste
(Compost instead!)



NO Foam Cups & Containers



NO Loose Plastic Bags, Wraps, & Films
(Find a recycling site at www.plasticfilmrecycling.org)



NO Needles
(Keep medical waste out of the recycling. Place in safe disposal containers like Waste Management's [MedWaste Tracker® box](#).)



NO Bagged Recyclables
(empty recyclables loose into your containers.)



NO Textiles
(Donate if possible!)
